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Gailmarie Pahmeier has been a Nevadan for over 30 years. She teaches creative writing and contemporary literature courses at the University of Nevada, where she has been honored with the Alan Bible Teaching Excellence Award and the University Distinguished Teacher Award. She is also on the faculty of the low-residency MFA Program at Sierra Nevada College.

A Pushcart Prize nominee, her work has garnered a number of awards, including a Witter Bynner Poetry Fellowship, two Artists Fellowships from the Nevada Arts Council and the prestigious Project Fellowship Grant. Her poems have been widely published in literary journals and anthologies. She is the author of The House on Breakaheart Road and The Rural Lives of Nice Girls, in addition to three chapbooks, the most recent of which, Shake It and It Snows, won the Coal Hill Chapbook Award from Autumn House Press. In 2007, she received the Governor's Award for Excellence in the Arts from the state of Nevada, where she serves as a Poet-in-Residence. Gailmarie is also a former National Literary Panelist for the YoungArts Foundation. In 2015, she was appointed Reno's first Poet Laureate; in 2016, she was inducted into the Nevada Writers Hall of Fame, and in 2017, she received the Outstanding Teacher in the Humanities Award from the Nevada Humanities Council.

Gailmarie lives in Reno between the Truckee River and the railroad tracks. She shares her home with her husband, two exuberant dogs. and a couple of incredible cats.
