## Improvising on a Blues Form with Eugene Shapiro

**Grades 6 - 8** 

Students are taught a fun and easy way to improvise on a Blues using a couple of Pentatonic Minor Scales, as well as devices such as call and response, repetition, use of space, and more.

Materials: Instrument of choice

#### The Lesson:

- 1. Explaining the blues form and the importance of blues in main styles of music, including jazz.
- 2. Jazz improvisation and a very easy, melodic, and fun way of improvising using two different Pentatonic Minor scales. Identifying the notes of each Pentatonic Minor scale so students know which notes they can play and how to practice them.
- 3. Demonstrate this approach by playing a Bb Blues on guitar with a backup track.
- 4. comp for the students watching the video, so they can play along with me using this new approach. Describe and demonstrate the techniques repetition, call and response, and use of space while improvising.
- 5. Review the blues form and this new approach.
