Introduction to Vocal Technique with Vegas City Opera Advanced Grades 6 – 8 Grades 9 - 12

This lesson covers proper posture, breath support, placement of sound, diction, projection, and vocal health, with the goal of helping young singers improve their at home vocal practice and overall technique.

Materials: Piano, keyboard, or piano app (several free options available), mirror (optional)

 - a. Larynx (voice box)
 - b. Face/mouth
 - c. Breathing apparatus

- 3. Proper posture for singing

- 4. Breathing exercises for singers
- 5. Vocal Warmups
 - a. Singing exercises
 - b. Diction exercise
 - c. Projection
- 6. Vocal Health

<u>Connection to Literacy</u>: Vegas City Opera's virtual lesson on vocal technique connects to literacy by having students listen to the content provided and then connect the provided content to their individual technique. The lesson will also introduce singers to vocabulary associated with the study of solo singing, including but not limited to diaphragm, resonance, and larynx. As singers progress in their vocal journeys, they will display comprehension of the concepts leading to better performance outcomes.
