Krista Lukas writes both prose and poetry. Her essays, short stories, and interviews have appeared in *Jewish Women's Literary Annual*, *New Millennium Writings*, and *Los Angeles Review of Books*. She is the author of a poetry collection, *Fans of My Unconscious*, poems from which were selected for the *Best American Poetry 2006* and *The Writer's Almanac*.

Born and raised in the North Lake Tahoe area, Krista Lukas earned her Bachelors of Arts in Literature from the University of California, San Diego (1992), and her Master of Fine Arts in Creative Writing from the University of California, Riverside (2015). A graduate of the teacher education program at Sierra Nevada University, she taught school in Douglas County, Nevada for thirteen years. For most of those, she served as a gifted and talented specialist, teaching in "classrooms" of all kinds, down to a storage closet off the multipurpose room where her students sat on the floor, unable to tune out blasting music or to dodge basketballs that flew in from PE classes. This gave her practice working with audiences--both distracted and attentive--at cafés, colleges, conferences, assisted living facilities, and detention centers in the United States and Europe.
